NEW FOR LIST			

RamsHorn-Livingston Sanctuary located in the Village and Town of Catskill, is over 436 acres of tidal marsh and swamp, upland forests and fallow farm fields. Access to the Hudson River is possible by canoe or kayak via the RamsHorn Creek. RamsHorn-Livingston is part of the largest tidal swamp in the northern Hudson River estuary. Audubon New York and Scenic Hudson cooperatively own and manage the property.

There are numerous educational programs conducted on the property. School groups attend field trips with lessons on a variety of topics. Badge programs and field trips are also held for local Girl and Boy Scouts.

Birding opportunities abound in every season with bird watching programs offered regularly. Sightings include Bald Eagle and other raptors, a variety of waterfowl, warblers, and many other bird species. Other wildlife, such as deer, beaver, and dragonflies are seen regularly.
